Our Worship

- Assured of His grace, we then listen to THE WORD OF GOD as it is
 preached from our passage for that day, and we all receive the
 sacrament of communion monthly as a "visible word" from God.
- After hearing the Word preached, we end our service with our RESPONSE TO GOD. We give offerings, affirm our faith, pray for needs in the congregation and world, and hear a blessing from God before singing a final praise to Him.

Through it all, God intends to bless us and change us by His grace so that we would go into the world to live for His glory. So let us come in humble faith, ready to hear and respond to our God and Savior.
