The Spread of Sin and God's Just/Gracious Responses in Genesis 1-11

Human Sin	God's Judgment	God's Grace
1. The Fall of Adam and Eve (3:1-6)	Curse on the serpent, ground; judgment on man, woman (3:14- 19)	God promises to raise up a conquering seed in Eve's line (3:15) and covers Adam and Eve's nakedness (3:21)
2. Cain murders Abel (4:8)	Curse on Cain; alienation from the ground (4:10-12)	God puts a protective mark on Cain (4:15)
3. Sin spreads and intensifies in Cain's line (4:22-24)	[Flood]	God provides Seth, and people begin calling on His name (4:25-26)
4. Sons of God intermarry with daughters of women (6:1-4); violence/corruption (6:5, 11-12)	The Flood destroys the ungodly (7:6-24)	God provides Noah (5:28-29) and spares him, his family and the animals (6:8, 18-20; 7:7-9, 13-16, 23; 8:1)
5. Noah's drunkenness and Ham's dishonor (9:20-22)	Curse on Canaan (9:25, 26, 27)	Shem and Japheth cover Noah's nakedness (9:23); the elect line continues in Shem (9:26); Japheth will enjoy fellowship with Shem (9:27)
6. Humanity proudly builds a tower to prevent dispersion (11:4)	Dispersion and confusion of languages (11:8-9)	God elects Abraham (12:1-3)
